Instructions: Using GPS, when you turn left into Glen Iris Farm, you will go down the driveway a **short** way, then turn right into the hayfield. You may drive on the grass down to the far end where there are cows, sheep, a pond and beautiful trees.

There is no bathroom accessible at the farm, but you may use the bathroom in the Boston Community Center on Main Street.

Lunch is on your own. We suggest a picnic or sack lunch.

12:30 - 1:30pm: Prep for Wet Paint sale. artists need to bring art if they wish to take part in the Wet Paint sale. Bring it framed to the Community Center.

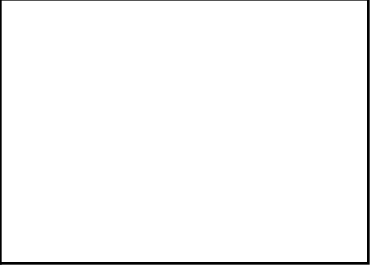

LOCATIONS

OCHLOCKNEE, GA

Hacienda Hamilton, 573 Egg and Butter Rd., North

The home of Tony and Margo Hamilton. Driving north on Hwy 19, you'll turn right on Egg & Butter. After the bridge you'll turn left into the driveway. Follow it down to the second gate and park on the right side of the driveway. Feel free to explore. There are 7 friendly (but sometimes noisy) dogs, plus chickens, turkeys, and geese. Two ponds and lots of pine forest.

There is a bathroom in the cabin, and in the house.

Town of Ochlocknee

There's an IGA market and a Dollar Store but not much else.

BOSTON, GA

Boston Community Club, 109 North Main St. in Boston. This farming town, 10 miles east of Thomasville, has many sites on the National Register of Historic Places. While most rural towns are disappearing, Boston just gets stronger. Surrounded by properties with extensive acreage and snowbirds who participate in winter hunting dog field trials, the wealth is hidden down the clay roads and backwoods. You can find cotton fields and farms where you may pull off the roads, but do not go into fenced farms.

We'll have a wet paint sale with light refreshments and acoustic music at the community center in Boston.

Danny's Cabin and Pond, 389 Peach Orchard Road (Clay road is slippery when wet.) Look for the first gate on the left, drive in and park near the cabin. There is a bathroom in the cabin.

Danny Groover is the mayor of Boston and has been a supporter of plein air events for many years.

Check out the cotton fields from his side yard or choose the lovely pond in the back. Just beyond the property on Peach Orchard there is a spot to paint the road canopied by oak trees draped with Spanish moss.

Glen Iris Farm, 661 Martin Rd, Boston, GA

Jason Freeman's beautiful farm. The winding dirt driveway goes past a cotton field and runs under spectacular old moss-dripping oaks to a gentleman's "farm." There are two ponds on the property. Feel free to explore the acres of old growth. He has farm animals and friendly dogs. Bring bug spray!

Other locations in Boston

There are silos, a train depot, Main Street shops, a Carnegie Library, the Baptist Church with a stunning stained-glass window, and peanut wagons, all in the center of tiny Boston. You are sure to find a place to paint. The stores have cute merchandise too.

Boston Restaurants

Lunch will be provided by Ann McCrickard on Tuesday! We will meet at the park in Boston (unless it rains, in which case it will be at Ann's house at 130 S. Stephens St., Boston)

THOMASVILLE, GA

We will likely paint on two historic streets, Jackson Street and Broad. Lots of people will love to watch you paint. This is our opportunity to attract shoppers to our Friday Reception and Exhibition, and Saturday Art Sale. Please encourage them to come both days. Friday is also the weekly Sip and Shop in downtown Thomasville, so let's attract those shoppers our way!

Open to all artists 18 years of age or older.

QUICK DRAW

All artists are to check in at the registration table/gazebo between 8:30 and 9:00am.

Competition: 9:00 - 11:00

1 entry per person. Canvases and surfaces may be toned but will not have any line or image on the surface at time of registration.

Acceptable mediums are watercolor, oil, pastels, acrylic, pencil, Ink, mixed media. Only 2-dimension works will be accepted. No photography or digital work will be accepted. Maximum size 11"x14" or 154 square inches. No minimum size. Frames are optional but will help with appearance for judging and with the sale of the work.

Report Back: You will have until **11:15** to return to the registration tent and check in.

Judging: Paintings will be **judged between 11:15 and 12:00**. Winners will be announced at the registration gazebo. Awards will be presented for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places.

Vashti campus has plenty of parking, and a bathroom on the 2nd floor Bishop Hall.

Boston Community Center has bathrooms. Parking is on the street.

There are restrooms and plenty of parking at Cherokee Lake Park.
